



Learning About Traffic Safety

In September the Dragonflies continued to discuss some of the safety rules that we follow in school and outside of school. One of the safety rules we've been working on is how to cross the street properly. The teachers prepared traffic lights made out of construction paper and presented them to the children during circle time. Teacher Anna also taught the children a song called "Twinkle Twinkle Traffic Light" sung to

the tune of "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star". In this song, the children opened their hands and fingers to represent blinking traffic lights. The children also learned from this song that red means stop, green means go, and yellow means go very slow. In addition, we played a game called Cross the Street during our English and Cantonese circle times. The children learned how to use their eyes to look at the traffic lights and to watch for cars driving by. Teacher Anna pretended to be a car driving by. Teacher Amy held up the traffic lights, while Teacher Bao Wen helped the children to cross the street.

Through this game, the children learned that we should first stop at the curb while holding hands with one or two friends. They also learned that their eyes should be on the traffic lights and that they should then turn their heads to the left and right, and then back to the left. They should walk across the street, rather than running, jumping, or skipping. It is also important to listen to the teachers' directions and for adults to focus on crossing the street rather than playing with their phones. Lastly, Hao Yang, Ben, Jason, Tony, Raina, Constance, Rhyan, Jasmine, Jenny, Vivian, and Victor mentioned that it is not safe to talk or play with our friends while crossing the street.





Celebrating the Mid-Autumn Moon Festival

The Mid-Autumn Moon Festival is one of the traditional Chinese holidays. In order for the students to understand the history of the holiday, the teachers prepared different activities to help the children learn about it. There were a total of 3 activities. The first activity was making lanterns. The second activity was making pretend mooncakes out of playdough. The last activity was a party in celebration of the Mid-Autumn Moon Festival. Many of the students enjoyed the cultural activities which enriched their understanding of why we celebrate the Mid-Autumn Moon Festival.

In the lantern creating activity the students were separated into 3 groups. Each group chose a cardboard box to work on. The students were given many different art materials to decorate their lanterns. They were also given paint to color their lanterns. After the



decorating was done, each group had to come up with a way to hang their lantern. This activity utilized the children's creativity, color recognition, problem solving, language, and team work abilities.

In the activity of creating moon cakes, the teacher showed a real moon cake to the class. Each student was then given a ball of play dough and was able to shape and design the top of their mooncake. This activity helped to develop the children's fine motor skills through manipulating the play dough. It also taught them to recognize shapes and colors, and to utilize their creative thinking process.

For the Mid-Autumn Moon Festival party, the teacher prepared two different kinds of traditional mooncakes. One had red bean paste filling and the other one had lotus-seed paste filling with an egg yolk inside. The teacher also prepared festival foods such as water caltrops which are similar to water chestnuts, taro, tangerines, pears, bananas, plums, and apricots. The students were given a chance to touch, smell, and taste the foods. It was through the use of their senses that they were able to decide which items they liked and which ones they disliked. Through this party, the children learned that the Mid-Autumn Moon Festival is a time when family and loved ones gather together.


